The family decides who holds authority, who has access and what happens when the founding member is no longer there.

The engagement is a single defined scope. The archive it produces is permanent.

WHERE A REFERRAL IS NATURAL

Estate settlement. A family is clearing a parent's home. Physical media is present and unstructured. Photographs, slides, documents, VHS tapes. No inventory. No structure. The window to act is short.

Ageing parent transitioning to care. A family is consolidating a parent's home before a move. The archive question arises alongside the financial and legal questions. It is rarely addressed.

Blended family succession. A client with children from different relationships is structuring their estate. Financial succession is addressed. The question of who controls the family's historical record and who is excluded is not.

Business founder succession. A client who has built a business across decades holds not just financial assets but the documentary record of how that business was built. That record has meaning to the family and is currently unprotected.
